The "Barbary Deer" is also called the "Atlas Deer" or "Stag". Its scientific name is "Cervus Elaphus Barbarus". The "Barbary Deer" is native to North Africa; it lives in the "Atlas forests". It is an herbivorous mammal with an average of 10 to 14 years. It weighs between 100 to 250 kg. The "Barbary Deer" is smaller than "European Red Deer". It has dark brown colour with white spots on its back and flanks; and males have antlers.

Djurdjura National Park is situated in the northeast of Algeria, about 150 km east of the capital Algiers. The park was established in 1983. It covers an area of 82 square kilometers. It is about 60 km southeast of Tizi-Ouzou. The park has a rich fauna and flora. It hosts many forests of oak and pine trees and old cedars. There are also many mountains, gorges and caves. Many animals and birds inhabit the park such as: jackals, foxes, Barbary macaques, vultures, eagles and falcons. Some of them are endangered species. It is smaller than Belezma National Park which covers an area of 262 square kilometers. Winters are cold, with heavy snow. Temperatures fall below zero but in autumn and spring it is rather warm. In the summer, the weather is cool and sunny most of the season.

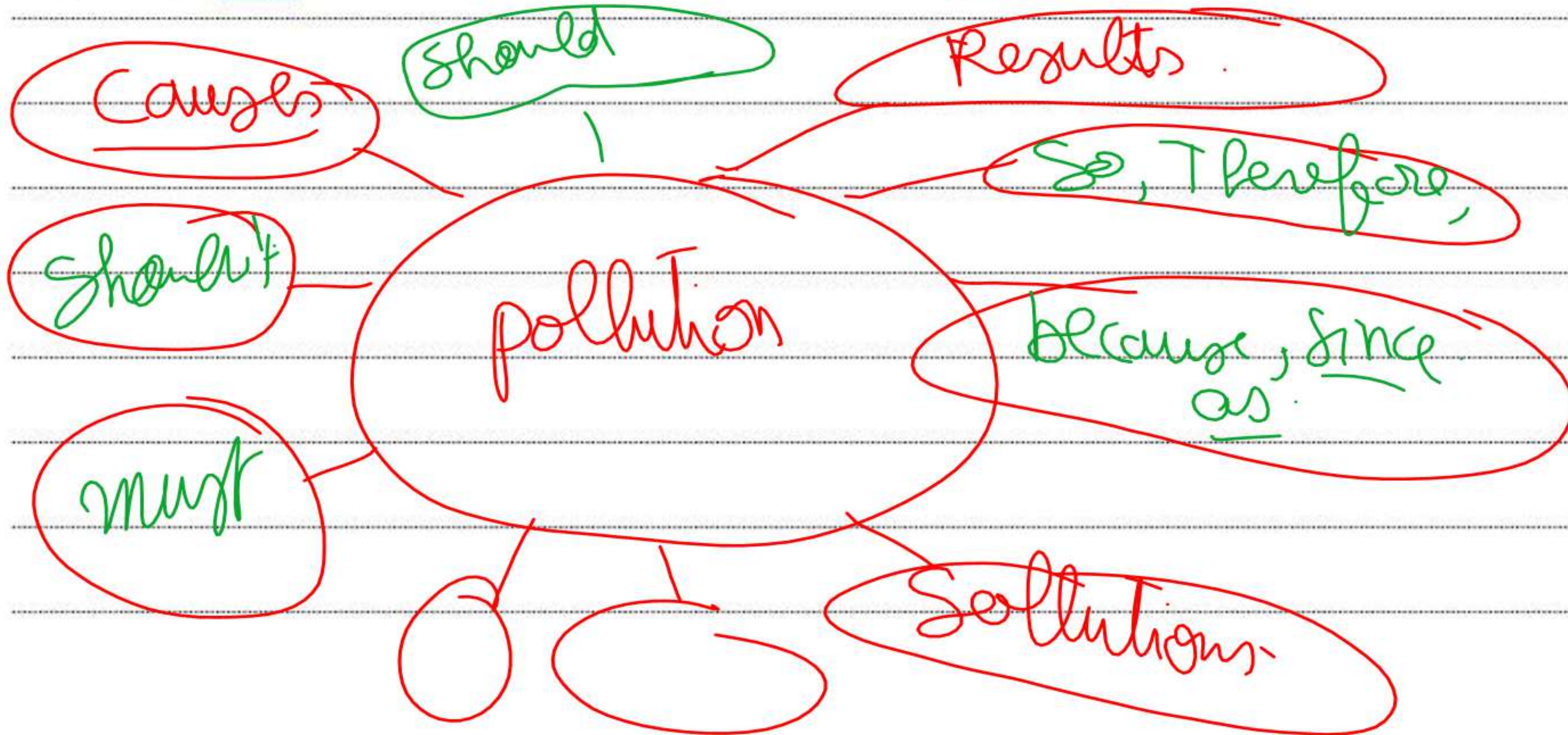

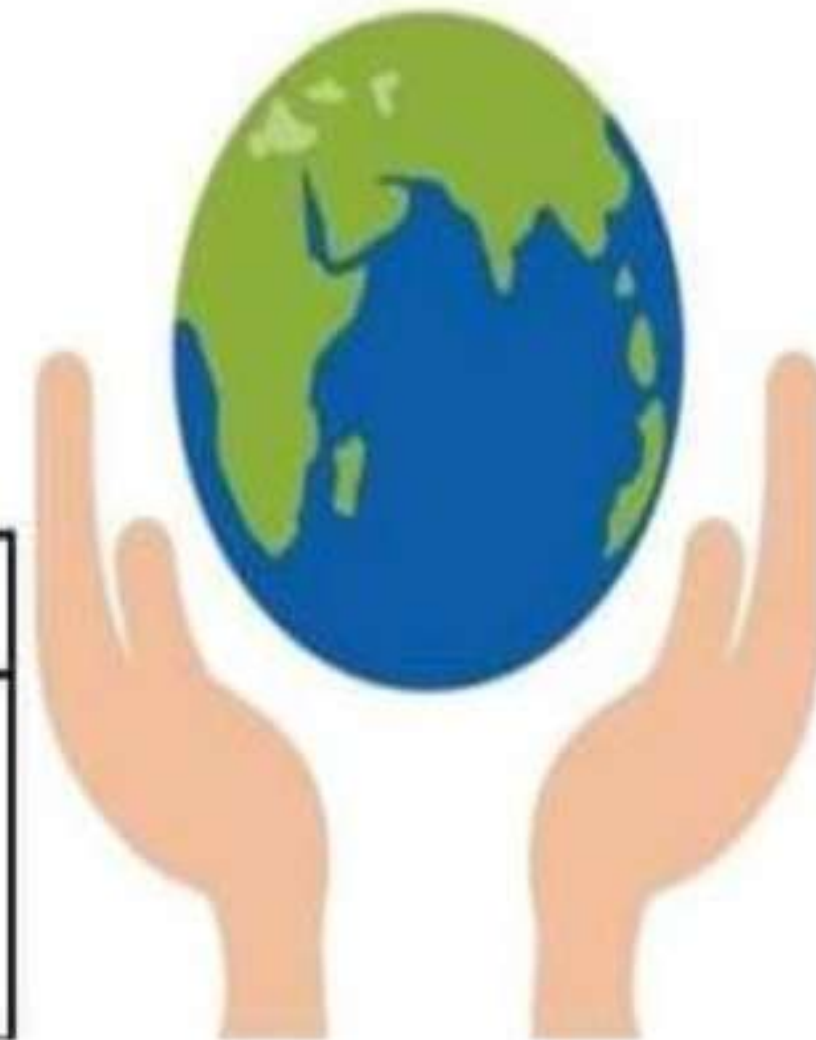

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Giraffes are mammals which live in Africa. Giraffes have an even number of toes and are the tallest land animals. Male giraffes grow up to 5.79 m tall from their feet to their horns and weigh up to 1950 kg. Female giraffes grow up to 4.87 m tall and weigh up to 1179 kg. Giraffes have very long necks and legs. Their fur has a light yellowish or brownish colour with dark spots. Both male and female have small horn like stumps on their head which are covered with skin. The horn is called "ossicones". The giraffe's numbers and habitat have been reduced since 2016.

Giraffes feed on leaves, grass and fruit. They can go without water for weeks. Young giraffes are called "calves". Giraffes' calves are 2 m tall and weigh 50 to 55 kg. Giraffes can live up to 35 years.

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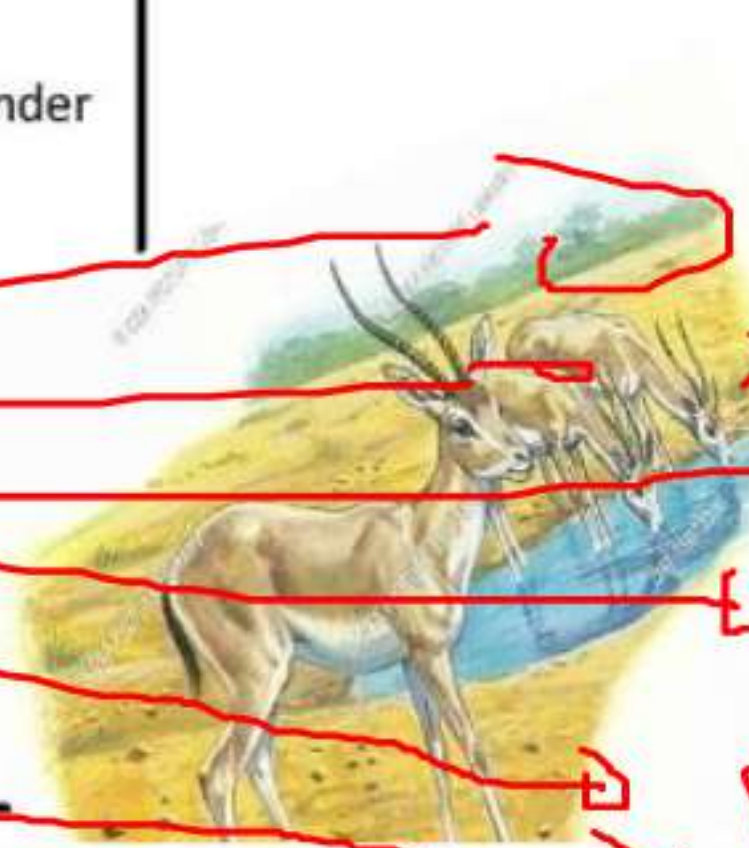

Gazelles are mammals which live in the desert of the northern part of Africa. They are about 100 to 116 cm tall and weigh about 20 to 30 kg. They feed on grass and short trees. They are graceful with a cream or yellow-white coloured body and slender horns. They can live up to 14 years.

People have hunted gazelles for many years because of their skin and horns. So, government must protect this animal which is in danger of extinction by creating association, creating parks and banning its hunting.



The tiger, one of the most magnificent animals in the world, is also one of the most endangered species in the world. A cat of beauty, strength, and majesty, the tiger is a master of all and subject to none, except humans! According to the USA's Endangered Species Act, an endangered species is an animal, plant or any other kind of wildlife that is likely to face **extinction** in its natural habitat.

The tiger's numbers and habitat have been reduced by up to 95 per cent since 1900. Of the eight original subspecies of tigers, three have become extinct within the last 60 years; and there are less than 50 South China tigers left on this planet, and possibly none, survive in the wild. Tigers increasingly compete with expanding human population and industry for land and food, and many are killed by hunters who sell their skins and body parts as ingredients for traditional Chinese medicines.

If these trends continue, the wild tiger may evolve from being an endangered species to become an extinct species. A few of the remaining endangered subspecies may survive only in zoos; others will live only in stories, pictures and myths, never again to roam the earth.

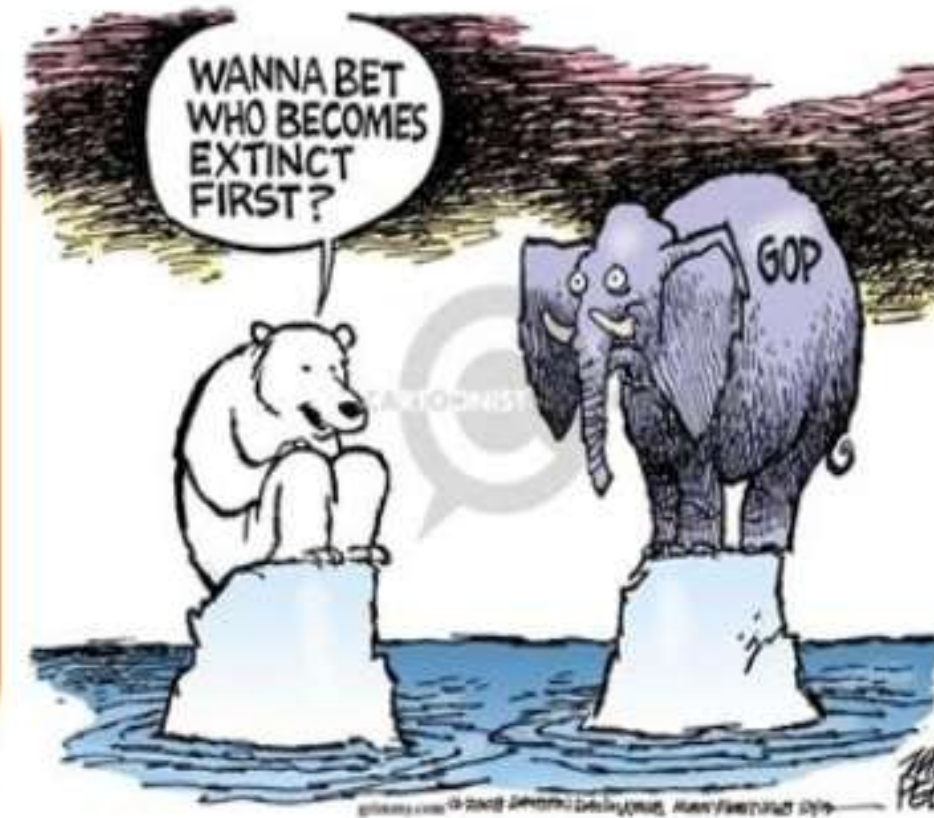
