RENEWABLE ENERGY

Most of the energy we use today comes from the burning of fossil fuels such as oil, natural gas and coal. These fuels are non-renewable. 

Don't be a litter lout!

Think about the item you plan to throw away. Maybe there's an alternative to disposal. It's true there is no solution to the problem of rubbish, but there are three things you can do to make less of it: reduce, re-use and recycle it.

We reduce the amount of rubbish we generate when we use fewer disposable items. For example, we can select products that have as little packaging as necessary. If we use these products, we will have less rubbish to dispose of.

When we re-use an item again and again, we also cut down on the volume of trash we discard. Pour yourself a glass of juice instead of drinking one from a juice box which you will throw away once it is empty. You can wash that glass and use it many times over.



When we recycle, we collect and separate items which we generally throw away. These items are then used to make new products. For example, we can recycle used aluminium into new cans... We can also recycle used plastic bottles and old newspapers. Recycling not only reduces the amount of trash we throw away, but it also protects the environment and conserves natural energies.



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

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Teachers may feel underpaid and unappreciated. However, according to the results of a recent career survey, **thev** are influencing and inspiring a very large category of people: teenagers. The survey found that teaching is a top career choice for teenagers, ranking as high as doctor - a frequent favourite job - and just above lawyer; which is another popular choice.

The survey was based on responses from more than 1,000 people who were aged from 13 to 17. The question asked was, "What kind of work do you think you will do for a career?" The teenagers were asked to give **their** top three choices. In addition to the three jobs mentioned above, the other top ten teenagers' choices included sports, science, architecture, business, the military, engineering and nursing.

Results have always differed between girls and boys. For example, a military career has never been a top-ten choice among girls, but <u>it</u> is often popular with boys. On the other hand, nursing is usually a popular choice with girls, but has never made the top ten with boys.

<u>Topic Two:</u> Environment experts say that our planet is threatened by the danger of air pollution and that we must do something to save our planet from the consequences of this big threat. Air pollution occurs because harmful substances are released into the atmosphere from various sources such as vehicles and factories. (Consequently,) this pollution leads to detrimental effects on both the environment and human health. Thus, the combustion of fossil fuels increases greenhouse gases, resulting in climate change. As a result, extreme weather events become more common. Therefore, if we don't reduce our emissions, the consequences could worsen. For instance, if we had used cleaner energy (conditional type 1), we would have prevented some of the pollution we see today. If we continue polluting (conditional type 2), the air will become even dirtier, causing more health problems and environmental damage. If we had taken action earlier (conditional type 3), we might have avoided some of these severe consequences.

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

Fossil fuels such as oil, coal and natural gas exist, and provide a valuable service. However, it is the side effects of using them that causes all of the problems. Burning fossil fuels creates carbon dioxide, the number one greenhouse gas contributing to global warming. Combustion of these fossil fuels is considered to be the largest factor to the release of greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. In the 20th century, the average temperature of Earth rose 1 degree Fahrenheit (1°F). **This period** saw the most prolific population growth and industrial development which was and remains totally dependent on the use of energy in Earth's history.

The impact of global warming on the environment is extensive and affects many areas. In the Arctic and Antarctica, warmer temperatures are causing the ice to melt **which** will increase sea level and change the composition of the surrounding seawater. Air pollution is also a direct result of the use of fossil fuels, resulting in smog and the degradation of human health and plant growth.



It would be difficult to imagine life without the beauty and richness of forests. If humankind does not act quickly, planet Earth will lose <u>its</u> forests forever. Deforestation has already resulted in the loss of over 80 percent of the natural forests of the world. Currently, the disappearance of forests constitutes a global problem affecting the temperate forests all over the world.

Deforestation occurs for many reasons. In the temperate forests of the USA and Canada, wood is harvested mainly for construction and paper products. In tropical rainforests, one of the most common reasons for deforestation is agriculture. Thus, many farmers practise an agricultural method known as "slash and burn." This method consists of cutting down trees and burning them to release their rich nutrients into the soil.

Deforestation causes changes in the Earth's atmosphere. Forests release large amounts of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere when trees are cut, especially when **they** are burned. The current yearly rate of carbon dioxide that enters the atmosphere from deforestation is about 1.6 billion metric tons. Therefore, it is clear that the burning of trees contributes to the rise of carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere. These rising levels will be responsible for 15 percent of the increase in global temperatures between 1990 and 2025. In addition, it is estimated that 5 to 80 million kinds of animals and plants make up the biodiversity of the Earth. If the rainforests disappear, many of these species will become extinct.

Do you want to be a better reader? Turn off the television! A recent study found that kids younger than 10spend about two hours a day watching TV, playing video games, or using computers. That is about the same amount of time they spend with a book! The study which was released on Tuesday included more than 1,000 parents of kids between the ages of 4 and 10 years. Spending a lot of time on the computer, watching TV or playing video games can make it hard to get better at reading. Reading is still popular, though .Almost 80 percent of kids under 6 are exposed to books. In fact researchers say kids spend an average of 49 minutes a day with a book. And what is the average amount of time spent in front of the TV or computer? about 2 hours and 22 minutes!

Victoria Rideout, a researcher for the study, says: "Kids, who watch TV, use computers, and play video games will have an advantage in their lives." "Media can help their learning, but there are disadvantages, too." She adds. Dr. Henry Shapiro studies kids 'development and behavior. He says: "reading, playing with toys, and talking with others is much better for kids learning than watching TV". He also says: "There is a good side of TV, computers and video games; kids are home, safe, they are learning things".

Teachers may feel underpaid and unappreciated. However, according to the results of a recent career survey, **thev** are influencing and inspiring a very large category of people: teenagers. The survey found that teaching is a top career choice for teenagers, ranking as high as doctor - a frequent favourite job - and just above lawyer; which is another popular choice.

The survey was based on responses from more than 1,000 people who were aged from 13 to 17. The question asked was, "What kind of work do you think you will do for a career?" The teenagers were asked to give **their** top three choices. In addition to the three jobs mentioned above, the other top ten teenagers' choices included sports, science, architecture, business, the military, engineering and nursing.

Results have always differed between girls and boys. For example, a military career has never been a top-ten choice among girls, but <u>it</u> is often popular with boys. On the other hand, nursing is usually a popular choice with girls, but has never made the top ten with boys.
