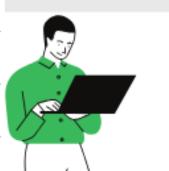


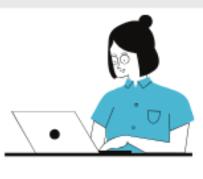

Should-had-better-ought-to are used to express strong advice or recommendation and function similarly to modal verbs (they must be followed by a stem).
