

Modal Verbs

Modal verbs are used to add different kinds of meaning to a sentence.

1. To express obligation, we use 'must / have to' E.g. You must respect others' opinions and beliefs.

To express prohibition, we use 'mustn't'

E.g. Countries mustn't impose their philosophies on others.


To express absence of obligation, we use 'don't have to, & sterm










